The U.S. Army Corps of Engineers

Since 1775, the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers (USACE) is an integral part of the defense and development of our nation. Today, the Corps of Engineers is divided into headquarters; nine division offices; 43 district offices, nine centers and labs; one active duty unit; and two Army Reserve theater engineer commands. The South Pacific Division is one of the nine division commands with four operating districts located in Albuquerque, Los Angeles, Sacramento, and San Francisco.

South Pacific Division

The USACE South Pacific Division provides federal and military engineering support in California, Arizona, Nevada, Utah, New Mexico, and in parts of Colorado, Oregon, Idaho, Wyoming, and Texas. Comprised of 2,300 soldiers and civilians at four operating districts (San Francisco, Los Angeles, Sacramento, and Albuquerque), the Division manages a broad range of challenging missions across an economically, environmentally, and culturally diverse region, executing an annual budget of approximately \$5.5 billion.

The South Pacific Division's Military Construction program supports 25 Army and Air Force installations, including Military Ocean Terminal Concord, a crucial component of military logistics and readiness, as well as Nellis, Cannon, Hill, and Kirtland Air Force bases.

The Division also partners with the Department of Veterans Affairs (VA) to build world-class medical facilities supporting our veterans. South Pacific Division is managing a \$3 billion mega-program to modernize seven VA hospitals in California and Nevada, working in partnership to deliver projects that will serve those who have served our country.

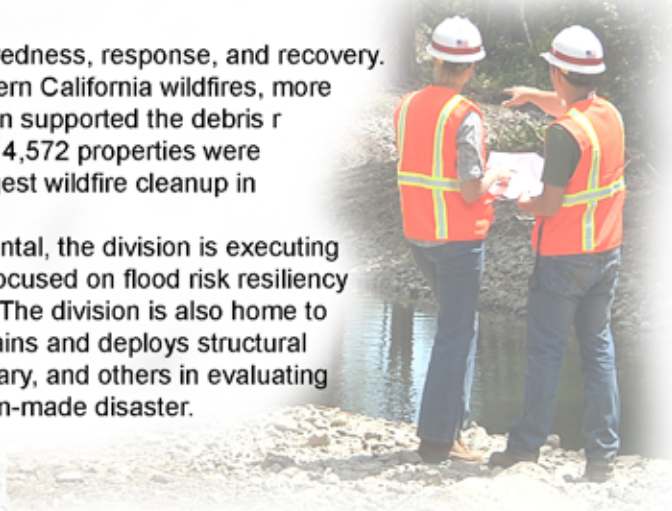
South Pacific Division's Civil Works program leverages federal resources for navigation, flood damage reduction, and ecosystem restoration. In the predominantly arid Pacific southwest, water resources are vital to agriculture, urban development, natural ecosystems, tribal interests, and recreation. Major river basins include the Sacramento, San Joaquin, Santa Ana, Colorado, and Rio Grande, which are governed by complex water rights. Accordingly, South Pacific Division works in partnership with other federal agencies, state governments, and local communities on collaborative solutions to these complex water resource issues.

The Division is also a leader in emergency preparedness, response, and recovery.

As part of the federal response to the 2017 northern California wildfires, more than 850 USACE personnel from across the nation supported the debris removal and other missions. Within eight months, 4,572 properties were cleared, moving 2.2 million tons of debris, the largest wildfire cleanup in California history.

Under the Bipartisan Budget Act Storm Supplemental, the division is executing \$2.5 billion in long-term investment construction focused on flood risk resiliency to reduce risk to communities and infrastructure. The division is also home to the Urban Search and Rescue Program, which trains and deploys structural engineers to augment FEMA task forces, the military, and others in evaluating immediate structural conditions in a natural or man-made disaster.

Albuquerque District

The Albuquerque District is a diversified, full-service District, performing design, construction, operations and maintenance services throughout New Mexico, Southern Colorado, and Southwest Texas. The District's programs include Military, Civil Works, Homeland Security, International & Interagency Support, Regulatory, Real Estate and Emergency Operations. The District supports three New Mexico Air Force Bases: Kirtland Air Force Base, Albuquerque, Cannon Air Force Base, Clovis, and Holloman Air Force Base, Alamogordo. In Arizona, the District provides design services to two Air Force Bases: Luke Air Force Base in Phoenix and Davis-Monthan Air Force Base in Tucson. Additionally, SPA supports federal agencies such as National Nuclear Security Administration, Department of Homeland Security, Federal Emergency Management Agency, Veterans Administration, and Environmental Protection Agency, various indian tribes and pueblos.

The District's Civil Works program provides Flood Risk Management, Ecosystem Restoration, and Tribal support. The Albuquerque District is home to the US Corps of Engineer (USACE) Tribal Nations Center of Expertise which helps deliver USACE missions and federal trust responsibilities to federally recognized tribes and provides technical support to military installations throughout the United States. Other work includes environmental enhancements and hazardous and toxic waste remediation. The District operates and manages three Regulatory Field Offices, four Resident Engineer Offices, nine dams and eight state campgrounds hosting 6.7 million visitor hours annually.

Sacramento District

The Sacramento has origins to the California Gold Rush. In 1893, Congress charged the Corps with regulating hydraulic mining to control debris that was clogging Sacramento Valley Rivers. In 1929, The Sacramento District became an official Corps district, serving as the federal engineers for parts of eight Western States: California, Oregon, Nevada, Arizona, Utah, Idaho, Wyoming and Colorado. The Sacramento District has Civil Works which includes design and construction projects, protecting human life, reducing flood damage, maintaining navigation, restoring abandoned mine sites, and improving watersheds. The District's Military Program focuses on Air Force and Army funded constructions projects. And the District Environmental Program supports the civil works and military missions, issue permits, design mitigation, and conservations of wildlife habitat. In addition to protecting life and property during emergency flooding within the Sacramento District, the District responds to other natural disasters by providing nationwide assistance.



The Sacramento District buys a variety of construction and engineering services: Barracks, airfields, control towers, maintenance shops, roads, dams and levees, dredging, and hazardous and toxic waste remediation. Other Engineering Services include concept studies, master planning, engineering studies, environmental engineering, surveying and mapping, and inspection services.

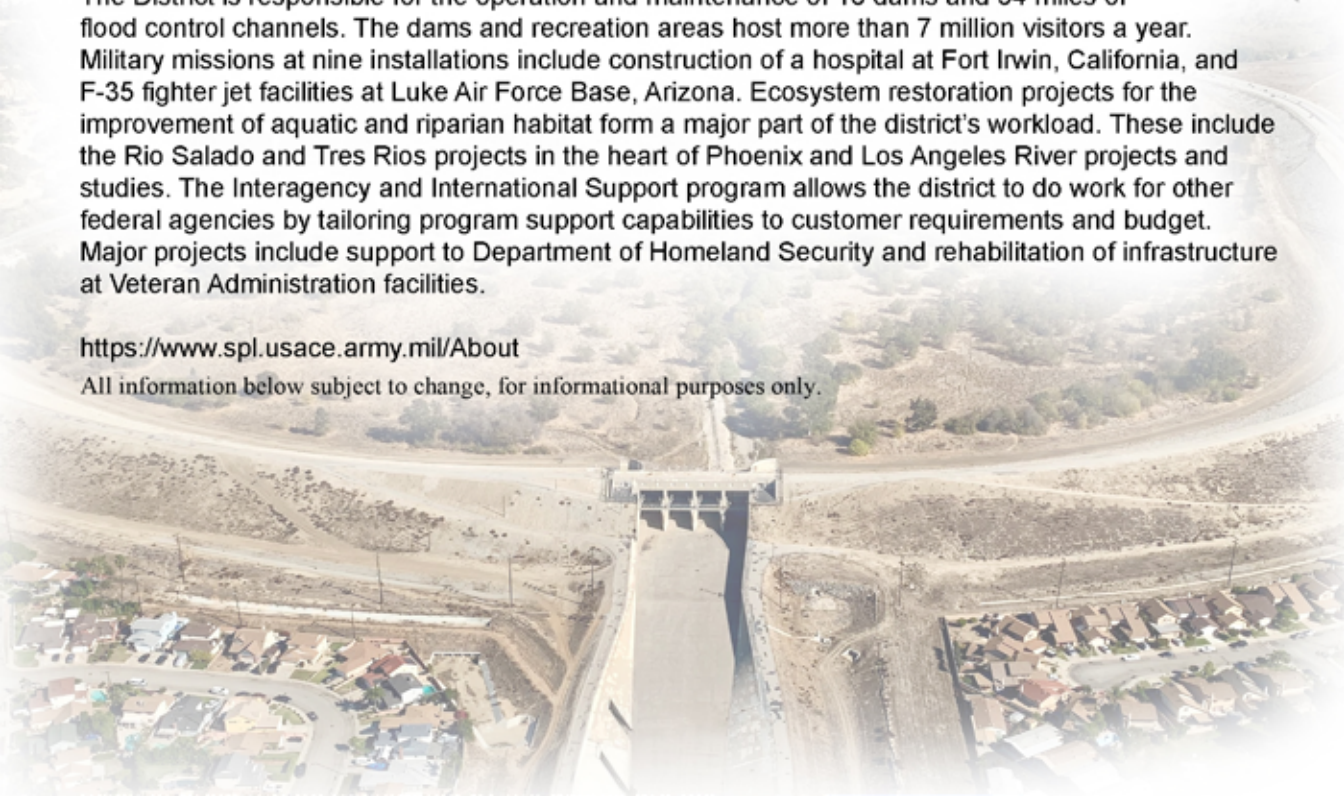
Los Angeles District

The Los Angeles District provides civil works and military engineering support to Southern California, Nevada, Arizona, and parts of Utah. The area encompasses 226,000 square miles, 420 miles of coastline, 14 harbors, and the highest, lowest, and hottest spots in the contiguous 48 states. Among the 14 navigation projects and 13 miles of breakwaters maintained by the district are the Ports of Los Angeles and Long Beach which account for a majority of West Coast trade and shipping. Major flood control projects include improvements to Prado Dam and the Santa Ana River Mainstem Project in Southern California.

The District is responsible for the operation and maintenance of 16 dams and 54 miles of flood control channels. The dams and recreation areas host more than 7 million visitors a year. Military missions at nine installations include construction of a hospital at Fort Irwin, California, and F-35 fighter jet facilities at Luke Air Force Base, Arizona. Ecosystem restoration projects for the improvement of aquatic and riparian habitat form a major part of the district's workload. These include the Rio Salado and Tres Rios projects in the heart of Phoenix and Los Angeles River projects and studies. The Interagency and International Support program allows the district to do work for other federal agencies by tailoring program support capabilities to customer requirements and budget. Major projects include support to Department of Homeland Security and rehabilitation of infrastructure at Veteran Administration facilities.
